It also states that the non-federal share shall be paid by the county.

The State, by statute, rule and reporting requirements, directs how these services are provided. There is also federal legislation directing some practices in these areas. The Federal Budget Reconciliation Act, as passed, eliminates the primary non-county source of funding for these functions. There is no state for case management services. **There are three state obligations: 1) Cover any loss of federal funding, 2) Absent that – remove all mandates directing how case management is provided, 3) Pursue removal of all related federal requirements.**
