

<p>The State requires Community Corrections to supervise juvenile petty offenders</p>	<p>M.S. §260 B.143260B. 235</p>	<p>Petty juvenile offenders can only be supervised for 6 months. Community Corrections supervises, but can do little to enforce sanctions. Offenders realize this early and often non-comply with sanctions. Supervision is very time consuming. A better solution would be to put supervision on a parent or guardian or allow Community Corrections to impose additional sanctions for those not in compliance and to extend supervision beyond 6 months in these cases.</p>
