Resolution to Participate in the Council on Local Results and Innovation Performance Measurement Program

Pine County Resolution 2019-28

- **WHEREAS**, In 2010, the Minnesota Legislature created the Council on Local Results and Innovation; and
- WHEREAS, The Council on Local Results and Innovation developed a standard set of performance measures that will aid residents, taxpayers, and state and local elected officials in determining the efficacy of counties in providing services and measure residents' opinion of those services; and
- **WHEREAS,** Benefits to the County of Pine are outlined in MS 6.91 and include eligibility for a reimbursement as set by State statute; and
- WHEREAS, Any city/county participating in the comprehensive performance measurement program is also exempt from levy limits for taxes, if levy limits are in effect; and
- WHEREAS, The County Board of Pine County has adopted and implemented at least10 of the performance measures, as developed by the Council on Local Results and Innovation, and a system to use this information to help plan, budget, manage and evaluate programs and processes for optimal future outcomes; and
- NOW THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED THAT, The County Board of Pine County will report the results of the performance measures to its citizenry by the end of the year through publication, direct mailing, posting on the city's/county's website, or through a public hearing at which the budget and levy will be discussed and public input allowed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, The County Board of Pine County will submit to the Office of the State Auditor the actual results of the performance measures adopted by the county/city.
