A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING REPORTING CITY OF ROCHESTER PERFORMANCE MEASURES TO THE MINNESOTA OFFICE OF THE STATE AUDITOR

WHEREAS, in 2010, the Minnesota Legislature created the Council on Local Results and Innovation; and,

WHEREAS, the Council on Local Results and Innovation developed a standard set of performance measures that will aid residents, taxpayers, and state and local elected officials in determining the efficacy of counties in providing services and measure residents' opinion of those services; and,

WHEREAS, benefits to the City of Rochester are outlined in MS 6.91 and include eligibility for a reimbursement as set by State statute; and,

WHEREAS, any city/county participating in the comprehensive performance measurement program is also exempt from levy limits for taxes, if levy limits are in effect; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of Rochester, Minnesota has adopted and implemented at least 10 of the performance measures, as developed by the Council on Local Results and Innovation, and a system to use this information to help plan, budget, manage and evaluate programs and processes for optimal future outcomes; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Rochester that the City of Rochester will report the results of the performance measures to its citizenry by the end of the year through publication, direct mailing, posting on the city's website, or through a public hearing at which the budget and levy will be discussed and public input allowed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Rochester will submit to the Office of the State Auditor the actual results of the performance measures adopted by the city.
