The results that were reported for the 2020 Elections are as follows: The results of the 3,988 ballots that the ICE tabulating machine counted for the 2 Elk River precincts and 50 ballots counted by the central scanner since they were a mail ballot precinct, for City of Princeton P-2. For a grand total of 4,038 ballots cast. The hand count came up with two vote counts more that the ICE machine that had read as overvotes .So the two ballots that

		were an over vote were counted in the hand count due to voter intent, that was determined by the election judges during the hand count. This fell well within the acceptable guidelines for a difference of not more than 0.5%
