BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, The Commissioners of Sherburne County will submit to the Office of the State Auditor the actual results of the performance measures adopted by the county.

Another ballot based on voter intent was counted as blank or undervote by the machine, but the voter made the mark outside of

That equated to a 0.0541% difference which was in the acceptable rage.
