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FILLMORE COUNTY REVIEW AND STATUS OF 2021 PERFORMANCE MEASURES

2021 Performance Measure 1) Reduce the total number of accidents that occur on County State Aid Highways, County Roads and Un-Organized Township Roads that involve fatalities and injury from prior year:

For 2021, the County had 2 fatalities, both on County roads. The County had a total of 45 injuries as follows: 15 on County roads; 16 on State Highways; 11 on Township Roads and 3 on City Streets. Comparing statistics from 2021 to 2020; 2021 had 14 less injuries and the same amount of fatalities as 2020.

2021 Performance Measure 2) Maintain Pavement Condition Index rating of 72:

For 2021, the PCI rating of 72 was not reached, Fillmore County had a rating of 70. We did reach this goal in 2020 as we were at 73.

2021 Performance Measure 3) Tobacco use among adults to national benchmark:

This performance measure was not reached for 2021 as the National performance measure was 17%, the State of Minnesota was 16% and Fillmore County was at 20%.

2021 Performance Measure 4) Child Support Program Cost Effectiveness:

This goal was reached in 2021, Fillmore County collected \$6.12 for every \$1.00 spent on the child support program. This is above the state average of \$3.02. Fillmore County staff continues to do a great job in Child Support collections. In 2020, we collected \$7.70 for every \$1.00 spent on the child support program.

2021 Performance Measure 5) Percentage of low birth-weight births:

As in the past, this performance measure is surprisingly good for the high number of pregnant women not receiving prenatal care and delivering babies at home. We are at 5%, the national percentage (8%) and the state percentage (7%).

2021 Performance Measure 6) Median ratio between 90% and 105% for three types of assessment ratios:

This performance measure was reached for all three types as follows:

2021 Performance Measure 7) Meet 10 day turn-around time for document recording:

This performance measure was reached for 2021.

2021 Performance Measure 8) 100% post-election results:

This performance measure was reached for 2021.

2021 Performance Measure 9) Increase by 5% State and Federal dollars brought into County for veterans benefits:

Fillmore County did not meet the goal of increasing State and Federal benefits by 5%. In the past year we decreased by 1%. This will change as the information for the new Veterans Home is not calculated in the quantifiable data.

2021 Performance Measure 10) Maintain 85% of veterans receiving services and/or benefits:

Fillmore County does have at least 85% of Veterans receiving services and/or benefits.

2021 Performance Measure 11) Goal of 7200 per 1000 residents for annual library visits:

For 2021, 3,421 was the total library visits per 1,000 residents, this includes actual in library visits and contactless visits. There were 17,009 website visits per 1,000 residents. Both numbers were an increase from 2020 as the numbers for 2020 due to the pandemic were way down at 2,407 visits and 11,853 website.

Just a reminder, for the 2022 goals and for the newly suggested 2023 goals we did decrease the goal to 5,000 visits.

2021 Performance Measure 12): Goal to keep debt service levy under 11%:

The debt service levy was at 2.32% for 2021. Per capita for the debt service levy is \$12.61. In 2020, the debt service levy was \$12.83 per capita.

2021 Performance Measure 13) Performance Measure of 40% recycling rate of Municipal Solid Waste:

The recycling rate for 2021 was 30.99% which was up from 2020 which was 26%. Fillmore County is probably making the goal, however tracking procedures would need to be improved and ways that could be done would be by tracking demolition debris more closely. Construction or demolition waste dos not count towards either end of the recycling goal so this weight could be removed from the denominator of the equation.
