#### About The NCS™

The National Community Survey™ (The NCS™) report is about the "livability" of Maplewood. The phrase "livable community" is used here to evoke a place that is not simply habitable, but that is desirable. It is not only where people do live, but where they want to live.

Great communities are partnerships of the government, private sector, community-based organizations and residents, all geographically connected. The NCS captures residents' opinions considering ten central facets of a community:

- Economy
- Mobility
- Community Design
- Utilities
- Safety
- Natural Environment
- Parks and Recreation
- Health and Wellness
- Education, Arts and Culture
- Inclusivity and Engagement

The Community Livability Report provides the opinions of a representative sample of 427 residents of the City of Maplewood collected from September 29th, 2020 to November 24th, 2020. The margin of error around any reported percentage is 5% for all respondents and the response rate for the 2020 survey was 17%. Survey results were weighted so that the demographic profile of respondents was representative of the demographic profile of adults in Maplewood.





#### How the results are reported

For the most part, the percentages presented in the following tabs represent the "percent positive." Most commonly, the percent positive is the combination of the top two most positive response options (i.e., "excellent" and "good," "very safe" and "somewhat safe," etc.). On many of the questions in the survey respondents may answer "don't know." The proportion of respondents giving this reply is shown in the full set of responses included in the tab "Complete data." However, these responses have been removed from the analyses presented in most of the tabs. In other words, the tables and graphs display the responses from respondents who had an opinion about a specific item. For trends, the margin of error from 2018 to 2020 is 7%.

#### Comparisons to benchmarks

NRC's database of comparative resident opinion is comprised of resident perspectives gathered in surveys from over 600 communities whose residents evaluated the same kinds of topics on The National Community Survey. The comparison evaluations are from the most recent survey completed in each community in the last five years. NRC adds the latest results quickly upon survey completion, keeping the benchmark data fresh and relevant. The communities in the database represent a wide geographic and population range. In each tab, Maplewood's results are noted as being "higher" than the benchmark, "lower" than the benchmark or "similar" to the benchmark, meaning that the average rating given by Maplewood residents is statistically similar to or different (greater or lesser) than the benchmark. Being rated as "higher" or "lower" than the benchmark means that Maplewood's average rating for a particular item was more than 10 points different than the benchmark. If a rating was "much higher" or "much lower," then Maplewood's average rating was more than 20 points different when compared to the benchmark.

#### Viewing the report

The report is organized in tabs across the top of the dashboard (e.g., "Highlights," "Facets of livability," etc.). Each tab displays the results of the questions related to that topic. In some tabs, there may be scroll bars at the right and at the bottom to help navigate through all the data on that tab. You may also have to use scroll bars within a chart or table to see more of the data.

There may be more tabs to view across the top of the dashboard; use the < > arrows at the left and right of the tabs to scroll left or right.

## **Methods**

#### Selecting survey recipients

All households within the City of Maplewood were eligible to participate in the survey. A list of all households within the zip codes serving Maplewood was purchased from Go-Dog Direct based on updated listings from the United States Postal Service. Since some of the zip codes that serve the City of Maplewood households may also serve addresses that lie outside of the community, the exact geographic location of each housing unit was compared to community boundaries using the most current municipal boundary file and addresses located outside of the City of Maplewood boundaries were removed from consideration. From that list, addresses were randomly selected as survey recipients, with multi-family housing units (defined as those with a unit number) sampled at a rate of 5:3 compared to single family housing units.

An individual within each household was selected using the birthday method. The birthday method selects a person within the household by asking the "person whose birthday has most recently passed" to complete the questionnaire. The underlying assumption in this method is that day of birth has no relationship to the way people respond to surveys. This instruction was contained in the cover letter accompanying the questionnaire.

#### Conducting the survey

The probability sample was divided into two parts: 1,200 recipients received two mailed invitations to participate in the online survey hosted on Polco; another 1,500 recipients received three mailings, several days to one week apart, beginning on September 29th, 2020. The first mailing was a prenotification postcard announcing the upcoming survey. The next mailing contained a letter from the Mayor inviting the household to participate, a questionnaire and a postage-paid return envelope. The final mailing contained a reminder letter, another survey and a postage-paid return envelope. The second cover letter asked those who had not completed the survey to do so and those who had already done so to refrain from turning in another survey.

The survey was available in English. Both cover letters included a URL through which the residents selected for the mail survey could choose to respond online rather than by mail.

About 5% of the 2,700 mailed invitations or surveys were returned because the household address was vacant or the postal service was unable to deliver the survey as addressed. Of the remaining 2,575 households that received the invitations to participate, 427 completed the survey, providing an overall response rate of 17%. The response rate was calculated using AAPOR's response rate #2\* for mailed surveys of unnamed persons.

It is customary to describe the precision of estimates made from surveys by a "level of confidence" and accompanying "confidence interval" (or margin of error). A traditional level of confidence, and the one used here, is 95%. The 95% confidence interval can be any size and quantifies the sampling error or imprecision of the survey results because some residents' opinions are relied on to estimate all residents' opinions. The margin of error for the City of Maplewood survey is no greater than plus or minus 5 percentage points around any given percent reported for all respondents.

In addition to the randomly selected "probability sample" of households, a link to an online "open participation" survey was publicized by the City of Maplewood. This open participation survey was identical to the probability sample survey and open to all city residents. The online open participation survey became available to all residents on November 10th, 2020 and remained open for 2 weeks.

#### Analyzing the data

Responses from mailed surveys were entered into an electronic dataset using a "key and verify" method, where all responses are entered twice and compared. Any discrepancies are resolved in comparison to the original survey form. Range checks as well as other forms of quality control were also performed. Responses from surveys completed on Polco were downloaded and merged with the mailed survey responses.

For both the probability sample and open participation (non-probability) surveys, the demographics of each dataset were separately compared to those found in the 2010 Census and 2017 American Community Survey estimates for adults in the City of Maplewood. The primary objective of weighting survey data is to make the survey respondents reflective of the larger population of the community. Both survey datasets were weighted independently to best match the Census. The characteristics used for weighting were age, race, ethnicity, housing type, sex, and tenure. No adjustments were made for design effects. Weights were calculated using an iterative, multiplicative raking model known as the ANES Weighting Alogrithm.\* The results of the weighting scheme are presented in the following table.

The survey datasets were analyzed using all or some of a combination of the Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS), R, Python and Tableau. For the most part, the percentages presented in the reports represent the "percent positive." The percent positive is the combination of the top two most positive response options (i.e., "excellent" and "good," "very safe" and "somewhat safe," "essential" and "very important," etc.), or, in the case of resident behaviors/participation, the percent positive represents the proportion of respondents indicating "yes" or participating in an activity at least once a month.

On many of the questions in the survey respondents may answer "don't know." The proportion of respondents giving this reply is shown in the full set of responses included in the tab "Complete data". However, these responses have been removed from the analyses presented in the reports. In other words, the tables and graphs display the responses from respondents who had an opinion about a specific item.

## **Highlights**

#### Residents report a high quality of life in Maplewood and plan to stay in the community.

About 8 in 10 residents rated Maplewood as an excellent or good place to live and would recommend living in Maplewood to someone who asked. Approximately three-fourths of survey respondents rated their quality of life positively and planned to remain in the city for the next five years.

#### Emergency preparedness ratings are on the rise, yet overall safety in the community could be an opportunity for improvement.

Public perceptions of safety and police services have dropped across the nation in 2020 and Maplewood also has experienced some declines. Only about 6 in 10 respondents rated the overall feeling of safety in Maplewood as excellent or good; this rating was slightly lower than 2018 and fell below the national benchmark. However, at least 8 in 10 community members felt safe in their neighborhood and in Maplewood's downtown/commercial area during the day, and from violent crime and fire, flood, or other natural disasters. These ratings were on par with the nation.

Residents' evaluations of emergency preparedness improved by 21% from 2018 to 2020, with almost 8 in 10 respondents assigning positive reviews in 2020. About 22% of residents reported participating in a public safety outreach event where police are there to make a connection with the public. Of those who had participated, about 9 in 10 rated these outreach events as excellent or good.

#### Residents value the economy and see it as an area of focus over the coming years.

The overall economic health of Maplewood was felt to be the most important issue for the community to focus on in the next two years with 9 in 10 residents rating it as essential or very important. About 6 in 10 residents favorably rated the overall economic health of Maplewood, a rating slightly lower than given in 2018. Assessments of Maplewood as a place to work and shopping opportunities also declined over this time. However, about 7 in 10 respondents gave high marks to the overall quality of business and service establishments in Maplewood; this rating improved from 2018 to 2020.

Only about 15% of residents in Maplewood believed the economy would have a positive impact on their income in the six months following the survey, a rating lower than the national benchmark but likely due to the economic crisis impacting many communities due to COVID-19.

#### Community members are pleased with parks and recreation in Maplewood.

At least 8 in 10 community members gave high marks to the overall quality of parks and recreation opportunities, fitness opportunities, City parks, and recreation centers or facilities; these ratings were on par with the national averages. Residents' assessments of the availability of paths and walking trails were exceptional and higher than the national benchmarks; furthermore, this rating improved from 2018 to 2020. Additionally, scores for fitness opportunities increased since 2018.

Maplewood residents were asked how the City should pay for recreational programs and nature center educational events once they reopen from current COVID-19 closures. About 4 in 10 residents felt that the City should create cost sharing partnerships. About 3 in 10 felt the City should keep the current funding system, which could increase property taxes, or that the City should increase participant fees. Only 5% felt that the City should completely outsource/privatize recreational and nature center programming.

#### **Challenges Posed by COVID-19**

When asked about the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the most common problem reported by residents was not knowing when the pandemic would end/lack of control. More than 40% of respondents indicated this was a major or moderate problem for their household. Other emotional health issues such as isolation and anxiety also were common with about 1 in 4 residents citing these heath states as a problem for their household.

Economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic were also important challenges for Maplewood residents. About 1 in 5 survey respondents reported a loss of employment or income due to the pandemic as a major or moderate problem, while 1 in 10 residents indicated that paying for food or housing was an issue.


Other pandemic related issues impacting Maplewood residents included providing emotional or financial support for an extended family member (18% reported this as a major or moderate problem), access to recreation/exercise (17%) and helping children with on-line school (14%). About 8% of survey respondents indicated that household members testing positive for COVID-19 was a problem.

## **Facets of livability**

Every jurisdiction must balance limited resources while meeting resident needs and striving to optimize community livability. To this end it is helpful to know what aspects of the community are most important to residents and which they perceive as being of higher or lower quality. It is especially helpful to know when a facet of livability is considered of high importance but rated as lower quality, as this should be a top priority to address.

The quadrants to the right show which community facets were given higher or lower importance ratings (up-down) and which had higher or lower quality ratings (right-left). In the charts below you can see what proportion of residents rated each facet positively for quality and then importance. Also shown is whether local ratings were lower, similar or higher than communities across the country (the National Benchmark).

#### Overall economic health of Maplewood, 2020











## National benchmark tables

Taking the pulse of the community has little meaning without knowing what pulse rate is too high and what is too low. Comparisons to results from other locations across the country can help provide context to the ratings received in Maplewood.

Ratings are compared when there were at least five other communities in which a similar question was asked. Where comparisons are available, five columns are provided in the table. The first column shows the comparison of Maplewood's rating to the benchmark. In that column, Maplewood's results are noted as being "higher" than the benchmark, "lower" than the benchmark or "similar" to the benchmark, meaning that the average rating given by Maplewood residents is statistically similar to or different (greater or lesser) than the benchmark. The second column is Maplewood's "percent positive." The percent positive is the combination of the top two most positive response options (i.e., "excellent" and "good," "very safe" and "somewhat safe," etc.). The third column is the rank assigned to Maplewood's rating among communities where a similar question was asked. The fourth column is the number of communities that asked a similar question. And finally, the fifth column shows the percentile for Maplewood's result -- that is what percent of surveyed communities had a lower rating than Maplewood.


