## 2. Pension: First Certification for 2020 Fire State Aid

We are pleased to announce that the Office of the State Auditor (OSA) certified nearly 75 percent of volunteer fire relief associations and other pension entities as meeting all reporting requirements and are eligible for the Department of Revenue to determine their qualification for 2020 fire and supplemental state aid in the first round of disbursements. State aid will be disbursed on or about October 1 for those plans that met the reporting requirements.

A list of the 2020 fire state aid and supplemental state aid amounts will be posted on the OSA website when it becomes available.

## 3. TIF: Timely TIF Plan Filing Avoids Problems

## 4. Avoiding Pitfalls: Mayors and Council Members May Not Be Full-Time Permanent City Employees

The mayor and all city council members elected or appointed on or after August 1, 2010 are prohibited from being employed by the city. "Employed" means full-time permanent employment as defined by the city's employment policy.
