From the PER report from the November 8, 2022, General Election, three (3) Sherburne County Precincts were randomly selected plus one (1) precinct from the City of Big Lake. After the Canvassing of the State General Election for a hand count to compare the totals to the Image Cast Evolution (ICE) precinct polling place optical scanner, which was completed on November 22, 2022 starting at 9:00 a.m. in the Maple Room of the Sherburne County Government Center with the following Precincts: Haven Township Precinct 2, Elk River Ward 3 Precinct B, Clear Lake Township, and Big Lake City Precinct 3.	The results that were reported for the 2022 Elections are as follows: Of the 5,203 ballots counted between the 4 precincts, the hand count came up with voter intent on two ballots for 1 race that increased the vote by 1 vote for each candidate and reduced the overvote and the under vote by one each. As the tabulator counted the one vote as an over vote and the other as a under vote. The Election Judges of different political parties determined that the voter intent to cast the vote for the candidate. This fell

		well within the acceptable guidelines for a difference of not more than 0.5%
