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FILLMORE COUNTY REVIEW AND STATUS OF 2023 PERFORMANCE MEASURES

2023 Performance Measure 1) Reduce the total number of accidents that occur on County State Aid Highways, County Roads and Un-Organized Township Roads that involve fatalities and injury from prior year:

For 2023, the County had 4 fatalities; County 1 had 2 fatalities, 241st Avenue had 1 fatality, and CSAH 4 had one fatality. The County had a total of 29 injuries.

Comparing statistics from 2023 to 2022; 2022 had 3 less fatalities and 3 more injuries than 2023

2023 Performance Measure 2) Maintain Pavement Quality Index rating of 2.8:

The County reached this goal with the PQI being at 2.98 for 2023, this was an increase in this specific type of rating from 2022 of 6.62%. If you recall, in 2022 we used the PCI rating of 72 for the goal and it was reached, Fillmore County had a rating of 72.

2023 Performance Measure 3) Tobacco use among adults to be lower than national benchmark:

This performance measure was not reached for 2023 as the National performance measure was 16%, the State of Minnesota was 15% and Fillmore County was at 18%. The percentage did decrease 1% from 2022.

2023 Performance Measure 4) Child Support Program Cost Effectiveness – goal of \$7.00:

This goal was not reached in 2023, Fillmore County collected \$4.57 for every \$1.00 spent on the child support program, we are ranked 17th in the state. This is above the state average of \$2.68. In 2022, we collected \$4.40 for every \$1.00 spent on the child support program.

2023 Performance Measure 5) Percentage of low birth-weight births to be lower than national benchmark:

As in the past, this performance measure was reached and is surprisingly good for the high number of pregnant women not receiving prenatal care and delivering babies at home. We are at 5%, the national percentage (8%) and the state percentage (7%). This is the same result as prior years.

2023 Performance Measure 6) Median ratio between 90% and 105% for three types of assessment ratios:

This performance measure was reached for all three types as follows:

2023 Performance Measure 7) Meet 10-day turn-around time for document recording:

This performance measure was reached for 2023.

2023 Performance Measure 8) 100% post-election results:

This performance measure was reached for 2023.

2023 Performance Measure 9) Increase by 5% State and Federal dollars brought into County for veterans' benefits:

Fillmore County only had a 1% increase in 2023. We did not meet the goal, however we did lose 45 veterans, so an increase was unexpected. Fillmore County benefits increased by 17.5% in 2022.

2023 Performance Measure 10) Maintain 85% of veterans receiving services and/or benefits:

Fillmore County does have at least 85% of Veterans receiving services and/or benefits.

2023 Performance Measure 11) Goal of 5000 visits per 1000 residents for annual library visits:

For 2023, 4,167 was the total library visits per 1,000 residents, this is actual in library visits and contactless visits. There were 7,165 website visits per 1,000 residents. In 2022, there were 3,927 visits per 1,000 residents, but there were 15,367 website visits per 1,000 residents.

2023 Performance Measure 12): Goal to keep debt service levy under 10%:

The debt service levy was at 2.12% for 2023. Per capita for the debt service levy is \$12.36.

2023 Performance Measure 13) Performance Measure of 35% recycling rate of Municipal Solid Waste:

The recycling rate for 2023 was at 31%, which is up from 2022 which was 30%. We did not reach our goal; however, we did improve.
